Put all ingredients in a pan and cook on medium heat (stir frequently) until it forms a ball. Remove and cool. I add other things to make it fun like peppermint, vanilla, almond extract. The pumpkin pie playdough had a small jar of pumpkin pie spice. Enjoy!
