Welcome to Preschool! We are so excited to be here for in person learning this year! It has been a rough and confusing time for everyone, especially the children and we look forward to being back into a comforting routine. Preschool is all about learning and growing with friends and teachers that children trust and we work hard to provide the best environment for your child! We have extra health and safety procedures in place to help everyone stay healthy.

Arrival: At arrival you will bring your child to the door that has been assigned to our class which is Door #3. A staff person will be waiting to check your child's temperature and give them some hand sanitizer. If your child is temperature free, please give them a hug and goodbye and send them to line up by their teacher. We will then sign your child in. If your child is sad, give them one more hug and we will be there to take your child and comfort them for you.

Departure: Please pick up your child at Door #3. **Please bring your own pen & have your ID ready.** The children will line up against the wall by the door and as you sign out your child, we will call them over to you. Please remember to check their backpack EVERY day for papers.

Clothing: Please dress your child in comfortable play clothes that are easy for them to manage (no overalls, belts, hard snaps, etc.). They must be able to dress themselves in case of an accident or spill. Please send A FULL EXTRA SET of clothing (shirt, pants, underwear and socks) in their back pack daily. **PLEASE NOTE: We cannot change your child.** If further assistance is needed we will contact you and if you are unavailable we will call someone on your emergency list.

Masks: Your child is required to wear a mask at all times while in the building. Please talk to your child about wearing a mask and that we wear one to keep healthy and others safe from our germs. Practice wearing it for short times at home to get them used to it and make sure that they have a mask that fits PROPERLY on their face.

Handwashing: Proper handwashing is VERY IMPORTANT! We enforced proper handwashing before Covid-19 and now it is even more important!. Please work with your child on how to wash their hands: Wet hands, get some soap, scrub ALL OVER for a count of 20 (this is where children will learn math skills) rinse all the soap off, dry your hands, and then turn off the water with the paper towel.
